Georgia! Keep it Green and Clean

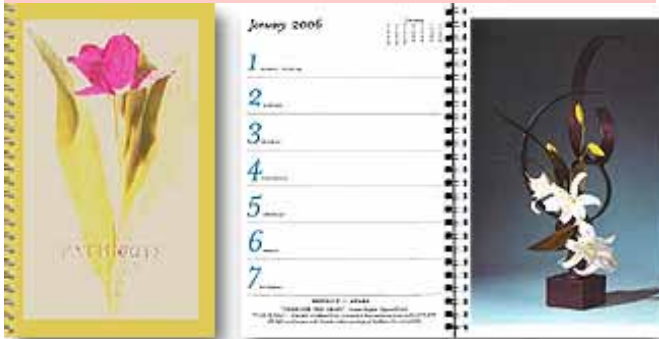

Partner of Preservation

A new category of support has been created. Clubs wishing to donate \$25.00 or more to the GCG Historic Preservation fund, will receive a Partner of Preservation Certificate at convention. Please consider this worthwhile project when you plan your annual budget.



“The Community – On My Mind” Fund

A Fund has been established solely for the purpose of funding civic improvement projects conducted by the member clubs or councils of GCG. This could be any project which beautifies or conserves in a community setting, and benefits all citizens of that community. Examples would be clean-ups; landscaping and beautification of a public building, public cemetery, public park, streetscapes, or domestic violence shelter; restoration work in watersheds; public school grounds improvement; or community holiday decorating, etc. Matching grants of \$200 maximum will be available annually. Details on the application process will be published in the August Board Briefs, but put your thinking caps on now to plan a community beautification project.

Mountains to the Sea

The Garden Club of Georgia's successful youth project "From the Mountains to the Sea" began in 1999. This phase of the project consisted of a six day traveling youth environmental camp. This unique out-of-doors hands-on experience with nature was in partnership with the Georgia Department of Natural Resource. Children eleven and twelve years old experienced the excitement of traveling from Georgia's mountains to its coastline learning to be environmental stewards of the land. This beyond the classroom experience for our campers has a new direction.

Our special youth project has evolved into Phase II. It begins with a new name and a new direction. Mountains to the Sea, Phase II will begin with the introduction of a new web site that is a learning tool for children of all ages. Four campers begin their journey in the Georgia mountains and learn about the environment as they travel all the way to the sea. Mountains to the Sea will teach you about Georgia's special types of terrain, plants, and animals in a fun and unusual way. Travel with our four cyber campers and experience this spectacular journey that will continue The Garden Club of Georgia's Special Youth Project.

#68 Video/CD - Spalding Garden Club, Dunwoody First Place and \$100 for producing a CD to give groups a plan to conduct gardening and landscape workshops for new Habitat for Humanity owners.

#72 Adopt A Roadside Operation Wildflower - Riverside West Garden Club, Atlanta. First Place and \$1000 for planting a wildflower garden at the entrance to the Williams-Payne Historic site in the center of Sandy Springs. By using native plants rescued before the tillers began and using native and pass-along plants, the cost was minimal but the effect was maximum.

#74 Outdoor Classrooms, Nature Trails Operation Wildflower – Spalding Garden Club, Dunwoody. Second Place and \$500 for designing and planting a native plant garden at the Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area of the National Park Service. A "Care and Maintenance Guide" with color photographs was prepared for park employees.
